THE 41 MOVEMENT – KAL AAJ AUR KAL

The 41 movement started with focus on Fellowship. Its origin can be traced to Round Table Liverpool in 1936 which had a large number of honorary members and the need was felt to have something of their own to keep alive the friendship acquired in Round Table. The 41 movement came to India in 1972 with the formation of the Madras 41 Club. The Association came into existence in 1980. Legendary Indu Chandhoke was the first President.

I became a 41er in 1994. Round Table had become a way of life. So, when the date of our retiring drew near the thought repeatedly came to mind - “After Round Table What?” We were lucky that our seniors in Tabling like Viji Iyengar, Ashok Dasgupta and Alban Scott had briefed us about “41 Club” and we knew



that becoming a 41er was a logical and automatic choice.

My club members are grateful to our founder Association President the Late Indu Chandhoke ji

for announcing our formation. After a few months our club had an impromptu charter ceremony by interrupting the meeting of the Area AGM of Round Table Area 4 on 19th September 1994 at Puri.

The 41 movement initially was pretty laidback and we at Bhubaneswar were no exception. For two decades we met among ourselves, our socials were very innovative, and enjoyable. We supported the flagship project YAPS and took care of the Yappers when they visited our city.

The NAGM at Bhubaneswar in 2013 was an eye opener. It was reminiscent of Round Table days. I started taking interest in 41 activities, Along with my wife Jyoti we became regulars at National AGMs of 41 Clubs and revived old friendships.

Having served on the 41 National Board manytimes, including President in 2022-23, I have seen the rapid growth of our organization.

Membership is increasing along with activities, purpose and enjoyment. The spirit of service is inborn in 41ers, which they have inherited as Round Tablers and have displayed the same from time to time during calamities such as floods and earthquakes.

YAPS continues to be the flagship project and has continued support of 41ers.

The introduction of “SYJ” (SHARE YOUR JOY) concept by President Rajeev Mehra in 2018-19, which supported community service projects with a modest matching grant from the National Board, has rekindled the spirit of service in 41ers.

In 2019-20, when C Sivaramakrishna (Babji) was the President the country came to a standstill because of the Corona Virus pandemic.

Our members rose to the occasion in providing

yeoman's service. Organizations like Jana Bank and Timken chose our organization for undertaking relief work. A new project FTDe 'FREEDOM THROUGH DIGITAL EDUCATION', an idea curated by veteran 41er Paresh Chaudhry was adopted as the long term project. In the same year there was creation of an entity 41 INDIA besides the existing ASSOCIATION OF 41 CLUBS of INDIA. This eventually cleared the decks for access to donations and CSR funds. I was the National Secretary that year.

The pandemic continued for a major part of 2020-21. President R P Venkatesh kept up the service tempo. Project 'ONE MORE BREATH' was established to increase hospital capacity during the second wave of covid. Within a short span about Rs. 25 crores was mobilized from benevolent donors. A vendor "MOINI FOUNDATION" was chosen for the FTDe projects.

Schools being closed, implementation of FTDe projects was delayed, but saw the light of the day during the tenure of Pankaj Singh as President in 2021-

22. Projects started getting executed. I felt honoured to have been able to arrange a sponsor for the first installation at Ghusuri, Howrah which was inaugurated by President Pankaj.

In 2022-23 with me as President we could give the FTDe projects a much needed kick start. It was taken to the next level with 45 installations impacting many children. There were no exemptions available and neither was 41 Club money used. I am grateful to my friend Padma Lochan Mohanty for supporting us as a major sponsor. 100 members came forward to acquire 41 STAR MEDALLIONS, the funds were used for FTDe. Right at the end of the 41 year 80 G exemption was received.

In 2023-24, President Srinivasa, along with a dedicated convenor Anurag Mehra and an outstanding Area Chairman Kiran Hebsur was able to take



FTDe to great heights with more than 250 projects, impacting more than 60000 students.

The focus on FTDe continues in 2024-25. We must see that it spreads across the country and our movement is identified through this wonderful project. President Pankuj Vats has zeroed in on other projects as well.

Our MTMs in the Areas are getting better and better. However we must ensure that attendance from the respective Areas is stepped up,

Nowadays, the National AGMs of 41



are events to be looked forward to in terms of 41 business and fellowship. I will always cherish that I took over as President on the high seas, on a cruise ship CORDELIA.

Even the FAMIT programmes are becoming thoroughly enjoyable. In recent memory Atthirapally

and Chikamagalur stand out.

Extension of the Association is very important. Membership is nearing the 4000 mark. The number of clubs in the country has crossed 300. The good work must continue so that our tribe grows. Many Tablers remain attached to Round Table even after retiring. It is heartening to note that many young retirees from Round Table are now coming forward with enthusiasm to become 41ers. Efforts must be made to attract all retirees to join 41 Clubs. We have to bear in mind that when the 41 movement started in India the members were 40 plus in age or a little more. Now the age band is 41 to maybe 90 years. In order to meet this generation gap we must have interesting programmes and activities catering to all ages.

Our in house digital bulletin 'Selfie' continues to serve as a mirror of our activities. Successive Editors have raised the bar and have worked hard to give us a magazine which has improved in quality and content year after year and is very

interesting and informative.

SupplyHouse needs revamping, streamlining and attention.

TANGENT INDIA is going great guns and growing rapidly. My wife Jyoti has served as Tangent President. Jayashree Chaudhry has done us all proud by serving a term as President Tangent International.

On the International front 41 India continues to create an impact and grow

in stature. We have had four International Presidents. Currently, President Dr. Siddharthan is from India. There have been three International Secretaries in the past. As 41 India President and as IPP, my wife and I have had the opportunity to attend some 41 International AGMS and HYMS, visited some countries in Europe and Morocco in Africa and were overwhelmed by the love and affection showered on us by our hosts and the 41ers we met.

The next HYM of 41 International will be held at Kochi from 16th to 19th October 2025. It will be a rewarding opportunity for our members to register in large numbers and attend this grand event, an experience they will cherish.

Along with Jyoti, I have travelled the length and breadth of the country as well outside. The 41 movement is evolving fast into a very vibrant organization and has started making its presence felt in the country as well as creating waves internationally. The future is very bright. The inherent strength of 41ers is tremendous and unbelievable. Members are coming forward to take up responsibility in the National Board, which is a very healthy sign.

JYOTI AI PROJECT BY TANGENT INDIA



Tangent India, an infant small organization, leaped to great heights under the leadership of Tangent Smita Chopra. The most impactful social project done anywhere in the world happened this year. Tangent India donated Jyoti AI glasses for the visually challenged to help them live a normal life, and read a normal human being's script in 120 languages. The original cost of these spectacles was Rs 25,600, which

Tangent India got at a negotiated price of 14000. Tangent India gave its members a matching grant of Rs 7000, if they raised another Rs 7000. Our commitment to the vendor was 100 glasses. As I write this article, I can proudly say that we are close to 600 donations, with a project spend of Rs 84 lakhs approximately. The emotional connect with the project and its huge impact on a visually challenged person attracted a lot of Tangent members and members of other forums. The overwhelming response is testimony to the fact that everybody who participated felt the worthiness of the project.

A casual thought by our president Smita, became a force of reckoning. April 2024, the groundwork of this project started by researching and evaluating. The first pilot project was carried out in July 2024. A small team sat down to scrutinize the modus operandi, all logistic hitches, anticipatory questions and coordination to undertake this monumental project across India. September 2024, at the Tangent agm this was declared open with



all readiness. Our under assessment of our capabilities and of our members made us commit only 100 kits to the manufacturer. Today as it is continuing, we are close to 600. Dreams can be turned into reality if purpose is backed by hard work. I thank all Tangent India members who believed in this project and carried out the project in different cities.

Past president Rajiv Mehra, and Past President Manoj Kapoor became the rock solid pillars of this project and the behind the scene guys. Had

41er Manoj, not researched, negotiated price and lay down the logistics and 41er Rajiv not got us the matching Rs 7000 grant and encouraged us and mobilized financial resources, this project would not have reached this great a height. Since this article is going for the 41 magazine, it is appropriate for me to mention other 41ers who came forward and donated magnanimously to Tangent India so that we could match the grant. A whole lot gave it as Rs 7000 for the kits to the





beneficiary but a few gave it to the Tangent corpus for this project. While I thank them, I would highlight 41er Manish Rajgarhia, Mumbai and 41er Hari Anna for their support.

It was a great experience for me. My first responsibility in public domain and I thank President Smita to have reposed her faith in me. It is a wonderful feeling to have done this beautiful project. The inventor of these glasses,

Mr Hunny Bhagchandani, a MIT alumni, was very kind to lend his company's support in every possible way. Organising training schedules and maintaining continuous support for all beneficiaries is a herculean task which we were apprehensive about, but the last spoke in the wheel was managed so efficiently that our ride became very smooth. He has promised us that he will give us these glasses for the same price forever. May god bless his kind of people. It is up to Tangent India and 41 India to carry on this project.

May god bless Tangent India and 41 clubs of India. ■

Feedback-Stockholm city, which I was looking forward to, was not part of the itinerary.



Accommodation and food were basic, and washroom facilities were below expectations.

FINLAND

Finland was the best part of the tour. From exploring Helsinki and Porvoo to jet skiing, yacht driving on Lake Saimaa, and enjoying lakeside saunas, every moment was rich and fulfilling. My host Manu Eskola was amazing—we bonded over billiards, darts, and biking around Nokia and Tampere. The perfect mix of nature, culture, and warmth made this the highlight of the entire YAP journey.
